In particular, please note that for your paper, the following requirements have not been met in the Discussions paper:

C1

- "The main paper must give the model name and version number (or other unique identifier) in the title."
- "If the model development relates to a single model then the model name and the version number must be included in the title of the paper. If the main intention of an article is to make a general (i.e. model independent) statement about the usefulness of a new development, but the usefulness is shown with the help of one specific model, the model name and version number must be stated in the title. The title could have a form such as, "Title outlining amazing generic advance: a case study with Model XXX (version Y)"."

Please name the COSMO model and provide a version number (e.g. COSMO X.Y-gpu) in the title in order to identify the code version this paper is based on. Please correct this upon revision of this article.
