This highlights some requirements of papers published in GMD, which is also available on the GMD website in the 'Manuscript Types' section:

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In particular, please note that for your paper, the following requirements have not been met in the Discussions paper:

- "The main paper must give the model name and version number (or other unique identifier) in the title."
- "If the model development relates to a single model then the model name and the version number must be included in the title of the paper. If the main intention of an article is to make a general (i.e. model independent) statement about the usefulness of a new development, but the usefulness is shown with the help of one specific model, the model name and version number must be stated in the title. The title could have a form such as, "Title outlining amazing generic advance: a case study with Model XXX (version Y)"."

In order to simplify reference to your developments, please add a version number and consider to add the models name acronym in the title of your article in your revised submission to GMD.
